**Material:** Ceramic beads, sisal

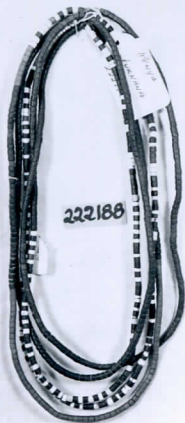
**Description:** Continuous strand of 5 mm beads is tied at one place to form 5 loops. Two loops are royal blue, one loop has two shades of blue, and two alternate blue and white beads with one red bead. Bought at local stores. Once imported from India now from Czechoslovakia. Number of necklaces indicate esteem of husband or father. Other beads (ostrich shell, banana seed, chyzome root) worn on top of blue.
