animal skin, paint

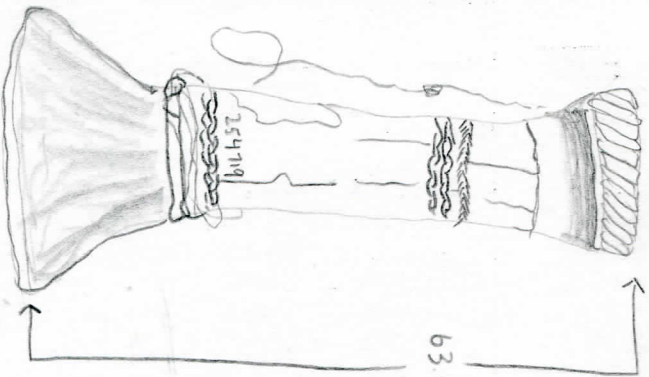
Description: Cylindrical wooden drum, with flaring
head and bell end. Skin stretched over head,
held in place by rattan band. Middle of drum
covered by split bamboo jacket, held in place
by rattan and cord bands. Inside surface of
sounding bell painted with reddish-pink ochre
stripes.

Dimensions: 63.5 L. 10.5 to 11.1 diam. at head
(in cm.) 17.8 to 18.0 diam at open end.

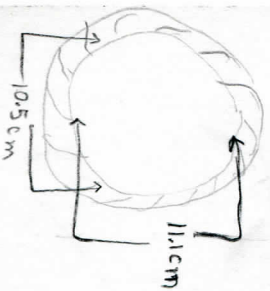

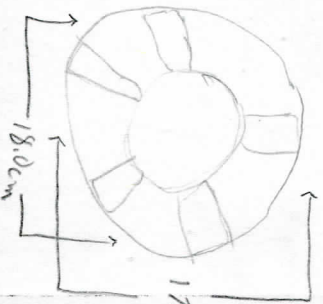
