Of green-glazed pottery. Pottery models of draw-wells were deposited in the grave, in the belief that the deceased were in need of a supply of fresh water. The square receptacle represents the well, a water bucket leans on its edge. The structure over the well is intended for the wellhouse, with a space for the pulley, which is protected by a tiled roof. In other specimens the pulley also is modeled.
