**Provenience:** Kenya Culture Prov. Lorugumu**People or Culture:** Turkana**Object:** Snuff carrier (Abriangang)**Material:** Goat horn, leather, wire

**Description:** A section of goat horn is hollowed by burning with a hot spear. Wet-dressed leather is stretched and bound over each end allowed to dry. One end is glued and the other is loose to form a cap, held to the carrier by an aluminum handle made of wire coiled around wire. Used by men to carry snuff or tobacco.
