Ish 1918 - The Tehuanae of Tehuantepic are large and imposing women, and by some travelers have been called the handsomest women in the world. The dress is equally striking. The skirts are of closely woven red or purple I cotton. This is upheld by a belt or faja. The upper garwents wrist of light rooten factory-made print of brown, purple or red color, known as huipililie or "little huipili" is worm The huipile has undergone a metamoghorie of use It & of muslin or more generally of some tright-colored leve with silk ribbons and has wide borders of stiff, starched less attacked to the sleeves, neck and waist while originally intended to be worm over the huipilite, it is seldom used so, but generally pect on upside - Lower with sleeves and collar hanging down the back, so that the wide lace ruffle forms a headliess framing the face.
