The iscahuipil is a peculiarly Zoquean garment. It is larger than the huipil but is seldom worn. Generally it is folded in a pad and carried on the head. The material is the same as used in the huipil, but the sleeves are longer and the neck smaller and sur ounded by starched lace. It is often worn with the lace collar framing the face.
