Zoque women wear a small shirt or huipil made of homespun cotton in bands of alternately close and open weave. The neck is low and edged with a black border. The sleeves are short and finished with a pleated piece of cotton in which realistic designs are embroidered in black.

The skirt is made of two strips of cotton a yard wide dyed in indigo blue. These are sewn together with colored silk threads. No belt is used.
