Zoomorphic resonator is a polychrome sculpture in the shape of a tiger-lion with a head and 2 feet at each end. Atop each head is an iron carrying ring. A winged green <u>naga</u>(serpent) is on each flank. (OVER)</p>

The saron deming (35003.,35025) depict old age and have only upper teeth. Sponge & cotton string added. Played with a single wooden gavel-mallet, sometimes made of kerbao. *Central Javanese name; Sundanese is saron panerus.
