Drum has 'Y' lacing with braided. Kerbao sliders at fork of 'Y's'. Three small circular holes varying in size are drilled in one area. Heads, lacing of Kerbao. (Drum has a few small cracks near head and base. L.S. 1984). Drum is tuned by tightening lacing.</p>
