**Object:** Probably a Ciblon (double-headed cylindrical drum)

**Material:** Wood, water buffalo hide (Kerbaos) cotton string, oil-base paints

**Description:** Ciblon: double-headed cylindrical drum.

Kerbaos covered rattan band at top and bottom with kerbaos lacings attached. Cotton hemp? and cotton? ropes wound around lacings for tightening (probably at 2 different times in drum's history), also cotton string added to top of drum with carrying loop in 1975-6. Red paint is badly faded, traces of dark blue paint. Design probably triangular played by hand.
