**Description:** A: wood beater with 'mushroom' head, handle has traces of dark blue, gold, red and light blue paint. Remnant of cloth nailed on below head. Head was padded originally. B: Smaller beater, traces of black paint on handle, smaller mushroom head partially covered by dirty beige padding, thick padding and string below head.
