**People or Culture:** Sundanese**Object:** Gong suwukan or siyem (Central Javanese) or Goong anak (Sundanese) smaller of 2 large gongs**Material:** Bronze, cotton rope**Description:** Gong suwukan smaller of the 2 large gongs. Flattened bossed gong with raised shoulders is vertically suspended by red cotton ropes through 2 holes drilled near top of gong rim. Robes are looped around 2 hooks under center piece of gong stand. Gong has darkened, blackish patina with shiny boss. (Cotton rope replaced in 1977-78). Struck with a large beater with a large, rounded padded head. Sound is "waves of onion."
