Java (Sunda), probably Cirebon**People or Culture:** Sundanese**Object:** Rebab\* (2 string spike fiddle)**Material:** Wood, water buffalo hide (kerbao), staples, wire, nails.**Description:** A: Spade shaped wood resonator has 2 opposed "S's" carved on back, kerbao skin belly slotted neck fits on base of body. Notch is broken off. Neck is multi-turned, tapering wood peg. (Strings are missing). B & C: 2 wood pegs resembling elongated 'tops'. Neck is broken off. \*Name same in both Sundanese and Central Javanese.
