One side selvedge has a yellow warp stripe, the other a red and yellow warp stripe after several blue edge warp. This was the center of the garment. Single faced brocading starts 20 cm from the bottom and consists of bands of zig-zags, chevrons, lattice work mostly separated by horizontal stripes woven "on opposites."
