Comments: Badly eaten by unidentified insects leaving severe damage to wood but not a great deal to drum sound.

8/20/69 Treated in Conservation and Restoration Laboratories for insects.

Note: Damage was caused by wood-boring beetle grubs.

Treatment: Fumigation with methyl-bromide.
