Length Height

When a person is unable to chew the betel nut, either by reason of age or because of mutilated teeth, this instrument is employed. The nut, leaf, lime, and a small quantity of tobacco are put in the bamboo mortar and are mashed with the iron pestle until soft enough to be gummed.
